Bring your kayak and paddle the G-wave at the Glenwood Whitewater Park. Fly- fish on the Roaring Fork River. Watch the wildlife from the Glenwood Canyon Recreation Trail or feed the trout at the Mitchell Creek fish hatchery. Visit Doc Holliday's memorial in the historic Linwood Cemetery or take a self-guided walking history tour. Sample regional produce and listen to music at the Downtown Market on Tuesdays. Dance under the stars at the Summer of Jazz concerts on Wednesday. Watch movies outdoors on a blanket at Friday Night Flicks in August.

May 30-31, watch the US Freestyle Kayak Team Trials competition at the Glenwood Whitewater Park. June 12, enjoy free train rides from Glenwood Springs to Dotsero as Operation Lifesaver teaches train safety for drivers, pedestrians and bikers. June 13-14, car buffs can admire vintage vehicles at the MG Rallye, an annual event. June 19-21, celebrate Colorado's oldest festival at the annual [Strawberry Days](#) event that includes a parade, a juried craft show, free strawberries and ice cream, and live music. July 4, observe the fireworks from a seat in the park at the confluence of the Roaring Fork and Colorado Rivers. Return August 1-2 for the Downtown Classic Car Show. August 15-16, meet the Hotel Colorado Polo Team at the Devereux Cup polo matches.

Glenwood Springs is an easy and breathtaking 165-mile drive through the majestic Rocky Mountains from Denver, and there are accommodations that fit all budgets. Once in town, there are free hybrid buses to take guests from one end of Glenwood Springs to the other. The daily choices of free activities and adventures will create memories for visitors of any age or ability, a tradition started at the turn of the 19th century that still compels travelers today.
